2021 Pacific Northwest Classic Tournament

Our big tournament of the year is nearly here! It will be an amazing event with nearly 800 registrants, drawing players from the Pacific Northwest, California, Arizona, and many states across the nation. This tournament will be the first time we are offering a \$25,000 "purse" for the Pro player brackets. There should be some really good play, so we encourage you to come watch. No COVID restrictions are in place, however, as always, if you have been exposed to the virus or are not feeling well, please do not come and risk exposing others.

We will have 16 vendors onsite and a few food venues. This year we have tried to improve the food offerings, so please show your appreciation to the food vendors by patronizing their tents/trucks. Special covered seating will be available near the "Pro courts" (courts 15 & 16) to watch the play. Parking will be at a premium, so anticipate having to park some distance from the courts. The players will have access to the shuttles; everyone else will need to walk to the courts.

Big tournaments need many volunteers to be successful. Many of you have signed up on CourtReserve to help, but we still need referees and line judges. If you haven't done so, please consider helping in these areas.

As Club members, you are our ambassadors. Please welcome the traveling players and help them feel the "Bend" experience! Remember, we have a high altitude, but no attitude.

Updates on Court Utilization

I hope your summer is off to a great start and it includes some occasional pickleball with friends and family. The courts have been busy, especially during the peak hours in the morning before noon.

Schedule of play – The Club has claim to courts 5-16 every Monday through Saturday, 7:00am-2:00pm throughout the year. After 2:00pm, all courts 1-16 are open to the public. All courts on Sunday are for public play. Club days, hours, and court availability can be <u>viewed on our</u> <u>website</u>, if you have questions.

Round-Robin Play – These sessions have been well attended and continue the trend of past years. Please remember that if you sign up and cannot make it, you need to remove your name from the list the night before. If it is the morning of, you can remove you name and call the RR Captain at least 2 hours prior to the RR start time. Your privileges to play can be removed or suspended if you do not follow this basic request. Thanks for your understanding.

Guests – Please remember that to bring a guest to play, you must have a Bend Pickleball Club Guest Pass. This can be requested from Susan Dona, <u>sedona549@gmail.com</u>, who will then mail them to you. These passes are intended only for guests who come with a member to play a few times; they are not for continual use. Our <u>Guest policy</u> is as follows:

Guest passes will be provided to Club members with annual memberships, upon request. Each member can claim up to two guest passes. These will be permanently issued, numbered, and signed. They should be used for family and friends who are visiting and would like to try playing at our facilities. Members must not abuse the passes by giving them to people to use on a regular basis to avoid having to pay to become a member.

Drop-In vs. Challenge Court Play - These types of play are different! To clear up any confusion, please refer to the website for the skill-level-based, slightly more restrictive <u>Drop-In Play</u> versus the more "winners-rule" <u>Challenge Play</u>. Be sure to consult the 2021 Playing Schedule for available courts and times.

Training & Player Development Update

Upcoming Clinics - We have had a number of training events already this season. Much of the training has been at the Pickleball Zone, and it is great to hear the good reports from the members who have attended. However, not all the events have been well attended. Something we added this year is IPTPA testing at Pine Nursery Park. It occurred earlier in July. We may not be able to schedule more sessions this year, but it is on the list for next year.

Ball Machines - As you probably know, the Club purchased some new ball machines. They are available for reservation on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday mornings. We are learning the new machines, so please bear with the ball machine operators as they work to give you the type of shots you want to practice.

Speaking of ball machine operators, we recently had to cancel some ball machine practice sessions requested by members because no trained operators were available to operate the ball machine. Obviously, this is disappointing for the members. We need additional ball machine operator volunteers! If we are unable to get operators regularly signing up to help, we may need to cancel some or all future ball machine sessions.
