New Focus on Player Development

Introducing Match Making (really!) on CourtReserve

You may have noticed under the Reservations tab on CourtReserve a new selection entitled **Match Making**. This feature solves three problems:

- 1. Allows players to find other players that match playing criteria, e.g., practice, drilling, competitive, etc.
- 2. Enables new members who don't know lots of folks to find matches that are open.
- 3. Enables players to post a match and let other people join.

FIRST, a BPC member must set up their own open or restricted 'event' (without Admin access):

- Log into CourtReserve, click Reservations > BPC member play
- 2. Navigate to day and start times to schedule your match (up to 7 days in advance, as usual).
- 3. Click on **Reserve <hour>** to open the reservation window for that day/start time (as usual).
- 4. Check the **Is Open Reservation** box at the bottom of the window.
- Fill in preferences for your match in the Open Reservation Criteria window that opens.
- 6. If you want to add a description of the match, enter info in the 'What to expect

in this match' box. This will appear on CR calendar when 'Details' is clicked for the match.

- 7. If you want to limit registrants to select members, check the 'Is Private' box at the bottom and input a code number in the **Join Code** box. Text/email code to players of your choosing as the code is required to join the match.
- 8. Hit **SAVE.** Star on left of box will be YOUR reservation marking.

NEXT, for members to find Match Making opportunities for play:

- Log into CourtReserve, click **Reservations > Match Making** to see what's available
- As more members use this tool and post more open matches, you can filter for an opening that best suits your preferences using the options on the left side menu. Using Additional Filter > Eligible Matches only will bring up only those matches with a criterial you meet.

This <u>YouTube video</u> will walk you through some of these details. (Admin setup starts at minute 6:00; members should start at minute 27:00 for creating a Match.)

Phase 2 of this new feature will enable buddy lists and internal group communication. \mathcal{G}

The October 18 <u>Dink Pickleball Newsletter</u> shared: "CNBC recently dropped <u>a video</u> ... [that] included some fascinating statistics....



- **40 million** number of predicted pickleball players by 2030
- +11.5% average annual growth of players over the last five years (tennis grew by +4.2%, badminton actually went down by -3.7%; ping pong is down by -1.2%
- **45.1%** of pickleball players make over \$100,000 in annual income,

37.9% make between \$25,000 and \$74,999

• **\$256.2 million** – predicted valued of the pickleball paddle market by 2028; it was \$152.8 million at the end of 2021

70 – number of countries pickleball is currently played in (to qualify as an Olympic sport, it needs to be played in at least 75 countries)."
