The Bend Pickleball Club has utilized different logos in the past, often simultaneously in different places for different purposes. The Board decided that a more cohesive approach and modern look was in order. A Board committee commenced work with a local designer to develop a primary (main) logo. While I appreciate the beauty of the fall season in Central Oregon, I am already looking forward to spring.

The BPC Board continues to keep the Club moving forward. We are introducing a new logo, along with complementary images for specific purposes, to better establish our brand among members, sponsors, and visitors to Bend. We hope to offer a line of branded merchandise for online purchase in time for the 2024 Season Opener.

The Calcutta Tournament was great fun, and I enjoyed meeting new members, putting faces to names, and seeing many old friends. Registrants enjoyed a delicious dinner and bidding in the auction that generated a little money for courts. Tournament results are available below.

Speaking of courts, Bend Park and Recreation District (BPRD) has been working with the Club on the prospect of adding new courts to Pine Nursery Park (PNP). I now can tell you that there will be 8 new courts at PNP. The precise placement and other details have yet to be worked out. BPRD still has more planning and public announcements to make. The preliminary estimate is that new courts are about 2 years out. We will keep you informed as things firm up.

A group of members led by Justin Rose are working on a plan for permanent lighting on PNP courts 9-16. This ambitious project will benefit Club members and the public, particularly the many players whose work schedules prevent them from playing during the day. Lighting would also help extend tournament play at PNP. The group is looking for project funding in the form of donations. The Board voted at the October 5 meeting to match up to \$30,000 for the installation of lighting at PNP to help get that project done. If you are interested in helping, I can put you in touch with the right people.



We had planned to end round robins at Pine Nursery Park on October 30, but by popular demand we are **extending RRs until November 22**, now the official season close. This will be dependent upon having Captains and players still signing up. Court reservations are still available; please use CourtReserve to book. No RRs will be scheduled throughout the winter months; Courts 5-16 will be available to members 9:00am-3:00pm.

Effective October 30, <u>start time</u> for round robins at Pine Nursery Park will be moved up to <u>10:00am</u> (from 9:00am), and Club play on Courts 5-16 extends to 3:00pm (from 2:00pm).

Thank you to all the round robin captains who helped make this season so successful for 3.0/3.5 rated players.

We did make adjustments again this year on our court play by adding more 3.5 RRs and making other changes to positively impact member play. Should you have thoughts about this, please let me know.

Take Note - It has been a great and busy season with courts during the prime morning times full of members. However, on occasion, we've had instances of members who have registered (committed) to play fail to show without the required 24-hour advance notice. This blocks members on the waitlist from playing and throws off that day's play. Be advised that we will be tracking those registrants who do not show up. The possibility of corrective action, including suspension for a time, is a real possibility. Please be courteous, and let your captains know if you cannot make scheduled play. Thank you.

Attention New Members - Over 200 name badges remain unclaimed in the Pine Nursery shed. If yours is one of them, please stop by the shed any weekday morning by Wednesday, November 22, to pick it up.

Training clinics focused on serve/return, transitioning to the non-volley zone, dinking and resets with an open paddle face, and general tips on footwork, court positioning,

2023 Fall Calcutta Tournament

The Fall Calcutta was a fundraising event held the last week of September. In a Calcutta tournament, funds are raised through the "sale" of tournament players and teams in an auction held pre-tournament. Funds from the sale are split between the Club and the event. Event funds are pooled, and the first-, second-, and third-place teams receive a share of their respective pool at the end of the tournament. Our Club funds were designated for the development of additional pickleball courts.



Signups opened on August 20, resulting in 60 player entries. (We had hoped for 96 entries.... Maybe next year, given this year's fun time.) Players attended the pre-tournament "Reveal" dinner/auction two days prior to the day of play.

The Setup

Skill Groups - The sixty players were first grouped into 3 "skill groups" and given a letter to designate the group.

- A Group: Twenty 3.0-3.5 players
- B Group: Twenty 3.5-4.0 players
- C Group: Twenty 4.0-4.5+ players

<u>Pairings</u> - Players were then paired within each skill group with the goal of achieving an appropriate balance of skill from any given pairing to the next. This created 10 pairs of players ("pairings") in each of the three groups.

<u>Teams</u> - Next, one pairing (2 players) was randomly selected from each of the three skill groups to form a "team" of six players. This resulted in 10 teams.

<u>Divisions</u> - The teams were randomly split into two divisions:

- Broken Top = five teams: Blue, Green, Red, White, and Black
- Mt. Bachelor = five teams: Blue, Green, Red, White, and Black

The Process

Each pairing would participate in a double round robin against other teams within their group and division. For example, the Mt. Bachelor Blue Team-Group A pairing would play against the Group A pairings in the Green, Red, White, and Black teams within their division. The B and C pairings would do the same. All pairings in the Broken Top division would also do the same within their division. This resulted in each pairing in each group playing 8 games with two byes.

The Auction

The "Reveal" dinner on Thursday, September 28, was catered by Bleu Bite Catering and included a delicious barbecued tri-tip meal with all the trimmings. Prior to dinner, players learned who their "pairing" partners and other "team" members were. Dinner attendees were first given an opportunity to participate in a silent auction to bid on any of the pairings.

After dinner, silent auction winners were announced, and the live auction for the 6 player "teams" commenced. Michael Mineni ran the live auction and did a great job of bringing in the bids. The evening ended with all pairings and teams sold.

Outcomes

Tournament play occurred on Saturday, September 30 at Pickleball Zone. Due to inclement weather, Werner Zehnder generously offered to host the event indoors. Each game was played in a 1-15/win-by-1 "rally scoring" format where a point occurs with any fault. This faster format turned out to be a lot of fun once everyone got the hang of keeping score.

When the dust settled, the winning pairs in each group were determined by the number of wins. Ties were broken by head-to-head play and point differential. Of the 30 pairings, only one pairing "ran the table," winning all 8 of their games. There was not one "pickle" (shutout), and many games were determined by one point. Winning teams were determined in the same manner.
