2024: A Year to Celebrate

This year has been incredible for the Bend Pickleball Club! Together, we've achieved some amazing milestones:

- Our membership reached an all-time high of 1,450, with 487 new members joining us through November!
- We hosted a variety of clinics and organized play events, keeping the community active indoors and out.
- The **2024 Pacific NW Classic tournament** was our largest yet, with record-breaking participation.

- Thanks to BPC's efforts, Bend now boasts its first lighted outdoor pickleball courts—a huge win for local players.
- A new camera at Pine Nursery Park (PNP) provides remote visibility of the courts, adding convenience for members.
- Our partnership with Grouper is helping many members get their dues covered by health insurance providers.
- A recent agreement with Bend Park & Recreation District (BPRD) means eight new courts are coming to PNP!
- And of course, we played *a lot* of pickleball, contributing to a global pickleball economy worth over \$1.5 billion annually.

It has been a pleasure to work with the Board this year, helping to bring these opportunities to life. Looking ahead to 2025, I'm excited for the new challenges and opportunities that will continue to put Bend at the forefront of pickleball in the Pacific Northwest.

Fundraising for the Future

Bend is known for its world-class pickleball facilities set against the stunning backdrop of Central Oregon. This reputation wouldn't exist without the strong partnership between Bend Pickleball Club and BPRD. Over the years, BPC and its members have been pivotal in funding the development and upkeep of the PNP courts.

Now, we're looking to the future. As reported in the summer newsletter, our agreement with BPRD to add eight new courts at PNP requires us to raise \$400,000. This aligns with our mission: *"to facilitate the growth of pickleball in Central Oregon."*

We hope every member will consider supporting this effort. Donations made directly to the BPRD Foundation will be tax-deductible. We'll be sharing details soon on how you—and even non-members—can contribute. Together, we can ensure Bend remains a top destination for pickleball enthusiasts everywhere.

Pacific Northwest Classic Hits New Heights

What an incredible event! Bend Pickleball Club hosted our annual **Pacific Northwest Classic by Thump Coffee** from July 25–29, and it was a record-breaking success. With **610 registered players**—our largest turnout ever—the tournament was a true celebration of pickleball and community spirit.



The excitement started early with a special Tuesday evening MLPstyle exhibition match, featuring local pros versus west-of-the-Cascades stars. It was the perfect way to kick off the week and set the stage for five days of exhilarating competition.

This year's event featured:

• **1,620 matches across 78 events** showcasing amazing pickleball for all skill levels.

- A round-robin format for amateur matches, guaranteeing every player at least five games. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive, and we're thrilled to carry this forward in 2025!
- **10** Pro categories with **121** competitors, playing intense double-elimination matches and vying for **\$30,000** in cash prizes. Spectators and players alike were on the edge of their seats!
- **30 dedicated referees** who officiated nearly 80% of the matches, ensuring fair play and professionalism.


With 1,347 active pickleball players in the Bend Pickleball Club, we're a community as vibrant as the game itself! If everyone showed up at once for a doubles match, we'd need 337 courts—stretching all the way to Gilchrist! Thankfully, through a variety of offerings, we make it work every day with just 12 courts from 7:00am to 2:00pm.

Round Robin Fun and Flexibility

Our members love the camaraderie of round robin doubles, especially at the 3.0 and 3.5 levels. These popular round robins keep players buzzing during the peak periods of 9:00–11:00am and 11:00am–1:00pm. While the summer sun makes post-12:00pm play a bit toasty, the early birds at 7:00am are often scarce. Consider this: Could a flex start at 7:30am entice a few adventurous players to join the fun? Let me know.

Variety for Every Player

We know that some of you prefer organizing your own foursomes, and we're committed to honoring those preferences. Plus, our new "Challenge Court" option has been a hit! This drop-in format offers total flexibility— come late, leave early, and play at your preferred level (3.0, 3.5, 4.0, or higher). It's all about meeting members where they are.

Managing court time is like solving a fun puzzle, and our goal is to create opportunities for *everyone* to enjoy the game they love. With 8 new courts set to open in 2026, the future of pickleball in Bend has never looked brighter!

Volunteers Needed for Pickleball Research Study

Graduate students in OSU Cascade's Doctor of Physical Therapy program, working under guidance from program faculty, will be conducting **a first-of-its-kind research study involving pickleball**.

They plan to study lower extremity biomechanical factors and functional performance of pickleball participants. The goal is to **develop evidence-based prevention and treatment strategies for pickleball-related injuries**.

Participants must be current pickleball players. Screening for the study is occurring throughout December via emails and phone calls. Data collection would occur on campus starting mid-January 2025. **Interested?** Say yes. —It could get you out of a pickle!
